

Hida Folk Village is an open-air museum where traditional thatched roof houses and single roof houses have been relocated and preserved. You can experience the traditional culture of the Hida region, various seasonal events and life in the mountains. In addition, fantastic illuminations are held in autumn and winter. Please feel the experience with your senses through the beauty of Japan's hometown in every season.



## Preserving the good old Japan into the future

Due to dam construction and depopulation in the 1950s and 60s, many villages in Hida region were destined to disappear. Hida Folk Village has collected and preserved approximately 30 houses, including four nationally designated important Cultural Properties, such as thatched roof houses, that were saved from this fate, and approximately 8,000 folk implements.

### Thatched roof Houses

he thatched roof houses built in the heavy snow area of the northern Hida region take advantage of the snow resistant properties of thatch.

### Shingle roofs Houses

Most of the farmhouses and town houses from the central to south Hida region were gabled buildings with a roof made of bords called "Kure" and topped with stones.

### Takumi Shrine

The main shrine was moved from Kawai village to its current location when Hida Folk Village was built in 1971. The ceiling paintings are only open to the public twice a year.

### Past livelihood and lifestyle

Workhouses such as a bracken flour shed with a waterwheel have been relocated and restored, and various tools used in the past for livelihoods and daily life are on display in each house.
